
### Could NU Life Furniture opened its doors in 2017. help you?

## Helping new tenants on the path to digital inclusion

Cadwyn wants to make sure that our tenants know about the benefits of the **Internet** and have the skills and equipment to access it. Being able to access the Internet will become more important for our tenants. With Universal Credit, you will only be able to apply for your benefits online. It's also one of the main ways employers advertise jobs and how applications are made.



Being able to use the Internet also means that you can **search** for the best deals on gas, electricity and insurance.

As part of our digital inclusion plans we are now giving a tablet to all of our new tenants. The tablets hold all the information that we used to give out in paper format, including the tenancy agreement. We hope that our new tenants will find them useful. Feedback so far has been really positive.

We are thinking about how we can help more of our tenants to access the Internet. This may be by letting tenants know about learning opportunities for those who may be less confident in using electronic devices.


Did you know that Cardiff has a free wireless broadband service (WiFi)?

## Universal Credit

community

Universal Credit is a new single payment for people who are looking for work or on a low income.




### It will replace:

- Income-Based Jobseeker's **Allowance**
- Housing Benefit
- Income Support
- Child Tax Credits
- Working Tax Credits
- Income-Related **Employment and Support Allowance**



You will need to make your new claim for Universal Credit online. You will then be required to attend a meeting with your Job Centre work coach to complete your claim and provide any evidence that has been requested.



You will receive one payment each month. The payment will be made in arrears.

It will be paid as a lump sum into your bank or building society.





#### **When will Universal Credit start?**

Universal Credit is being introduced gradually in Cardiff from November 2015. This means if you already claim a benefit, you will continue to do so until you are contacted by the Department of Work and Pensions (DWP).

To begin with, you will only be affected if you are making anew claim for benefit and are single, newly unemployed, and actively seeking work. In other words, anyone who would have previously made a new claim for Job Seeker's Allowance.

#### You will not be able to claim Universal Credit during this first stage if you:

- Are part of a couple
- Are responsible for any children
- Have caring responsibilities
- Are not fit for work
- Are homeless or live in supported or temporary accommodation
- If you are a homeowner

Any help you get with your rent will be included with your **Universal Credit payment.** 

You will have to pay your rent to Cadwyn yourself.

### **Preparing for Universal Credit**

#### 1 Get Online

You will need to claim Universal Credit online. You will also need an email account to complete your application. Cardiff Council offer free dropin sessions in locations across the city to help you to:

- Learn basic computer skills
- Use the internet
- Access online banking
- Create an email address
- Complete online applications to apply for jobs or benefits
- Use social media, shop online, and more

#### 2 Open a Bank Account

You must have a bank account to receive Universal Credit.
You will need budgeting skills to manage your monthly payment.

Cardiff Council has prepared a Help with Banking booklet that gives you information on bank accounts and your options. Cardiff Council Money Advice Team can offer you free help and advice on opening a bank account. Advisors in the Citizen Hub's across the City are on hand to explain banking terms and processes, making sure you understand what your options are.

### **3** Get Work-Ready

To receive your Universal Credit you will need to show that you are doing all that you can to find work. Cadwyn's Realise Your Potential scheme offers help to those looking for work or to up-skill their current job. They can assist with:

- CV writing
- Job application forms
- Interview techniques
- Universal Job match
- Job search
- Work skills training

## Albany Road Development



The Albany Road Hoardings, currently featuring artwork by local artist Nick Davies as part of the Made in Roath festival, are hiding a true hive of activity. Willis Construction are working on a project with Cadwyn to build **24 high quality flats** and a **commercial unit**.



We caught up with Site Manager Dorian, who told us: "We've had a couple of unexpected issues with the demolition and groundworks on the site, but we've managed to overcome them. The foundations are in and we are currently on target to finish in Autumn 2016. We are really looking forward to working with the local community. We'll be hosting visits from Albany Primary School during the project. In the New Year we'll also be offering taster sessions in construction for local young people."

### Wishing you a Stress Free **Christmas!**


